

THE SELECTION

LOCAL BEGINNINGS

The process of selecting Oklahoma's Teacher of the Year begins with local school districts. Each school district selects a local Teacher of the Year. The local honoree prepares a portfolio to submit to a regional selection committee.

REGIONAL COMPETITION

For the Teacher of the Year competition, Oklahoma is divided into six regions. A team of educators, parents, and past Oklahoma Teachers of the Year select two finalists from each region.

STATE SELECTION

The Oklahoma Teacher of the Year is selected from the 12 finalists based upon:

- A portfolio,
- A videotape of classroom teaching,
- An individual interview, and
- Round table discussion with the state selection committee and other finalists addressing educational issues.

THE EDWARD C. JOULLIAN III SCHOLARSHIP

As chairman of the State Fair Board of Directors for eleven years, Edward C. Joullian III honorably served Oklahoma. As a promoter of the partnership between the Oklahoma Teacher of the Year program and the Oklahoma State Fair, Mr. Joullian has shown his dedication to the education of the children of this great state.

The 2012-2013 school year was the fifteenth year for the **Edward C. Joullian III Scholarship**. The \$5,000 scholarship is awarded to a high school senior in the current Oklahoma Teacher of the Year's district. The scholarship was established to support students with their postsecondary education, recognize the state Teacher of the Year's school district, and celebrate the contributions of Mr. Joullian to the lives of Oklahoma's young people.

THE RECOGNITION

FINALISTS ARE HONORED EACH SUMMER

The 12 finalists, along with their superintendents, are announced and presented to the education community at the State Capitol in July.

STATE AMBASSADOR FOR EDUCATION IS NAMED

In September, Superintendent Barresi will recognize several hundred local teacher nominees along with family, friends, and school personnel, at a special ceremony held in conjunction with the Oklahoma State Fair. During the ceremony, the Oklahoma Teacher of the Year is announced. **For 2013, Elaine Hutchison, Fairview Public Schools, received more than \$11,000 in cash and numerous prizes.**

NATIONAL TEACHER IS HONORED AT THE WHITE HOUSE

In November, Superintendent Barresi will formally nominate the Oklahoma Teacher of the Year to the Council of Chief State School Officers for national competition. The national winner is announced the following April.
